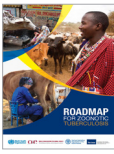

Climate Smart Agriculture: Building resilience to climate change

This new Open Access book on climate-smart agriculture (CSA) co-published with Springer, shares tested good practices and innovative approaches for promoting CSA systems in support of food security at country level. Its in-depth analysis will complement the new edition of the more hands-on Climate-Smart Agriculture Sourcebook, due for release in November.

ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

This book defines land concentration, accumulation, land-grabbing and foreign ownership in Colombia. It identifies risks related to large-scale investments in rural land and makes public policy recommendations, such as conducting risk-based analysis.

Through qualitative interviews and sampling, this report concludes that the cash transfer programme in Senegal improves food security but not income generation. It makes strategic and operational recommendations, such as improved targeting mechanisms.

Farmers' rights

An educational module to strengthen technical capacities for promoting farmers' rights at national level. It includes a description of Article 9 of the International Treaty on Plant Genetic Resources and reviews plant breeding programmes and other successful activities.

In a context of chronic poverty, conflict and food insecurity, this document sets out FAO's approach to restoring livelihoods, including through seeds and tools provision, resilience-building for internally displaced people and cash transfer programmes.

FOOD SAFETY AND NUTRITION



Forecasting threats to the food chain affecting food security in countries and regions

Using an integrated approach, this publication forecasts and monitors the occurrence of threats, including animal diseases, forest pests, locusts and plant pests, both at regional and country level. (48 pp.) Food Chain Crisis Early Warning

FORESTRY



Rapid woodfuel assessment – 2017 Baseline for Bidibidi Refugee Settlement, Uganda

Using remote sensing analysis, this publication provides data on woodfuel use and consumption. Noting that tree felling and woodfuel demand have increased pressure on the environment, it identifies opportunities to improve energy access, cookstoves and afforestation initiatives. Sustainable woodfuel for food security – A smart choice: green, renewable and affordable

This publication explores the link between sustainable woodfuel and food security (e.g. woodfuel trade offers direct cash for purchasing food), and examines opportunities for strengthening these links, including through forest management reforms. (42 pp.)



Using criteria and indicators for sustainable forest management

Based on 30 practical examples, this publication recommends integrating criteria and indicators (C&I) into national forest programmes through a participatory approach to improve programme design, planning and monitoring. (84 pp.) Forestry Policy and Institutions Working Paper

GENDER



Developing capacities in gender-sensitive rural advisory services – A training for trainers manual

Based on a pilot training course in Turkey and Azerbaijan, this manual addresses gender issues in rural advisory services. It increases awareness of gender differences in access to services, and introduces participatory tools for gender analysis. (114 pp.)
