ON DISPLAY

Ending the year with engravings and hand painted sceneries of agriculture and silk culture



The Library is closing the year displaying some of the most beautiful books from the Rare Books collection. In 1909 the President of China, Xu Shichang, and the former Minister of Foreign Affairs, Lou Tseng-Tsiang, donated a number of classic Chinese works to the library of the International Institute of Agriculture on the subject of agriculture. This collection was inherited by the FAO Library in 1951. Some of the highlights consist of the *Kangxi Yuzhi Gengzhi Tushi*, a rare volume on agriculture and silk culture in China published by the Emperor Kang Shi (1662–1722) containing hand painted engravings on wood plates.



Also on display will be the *Qinding Shoushi Tongkao* written on the orders of Emperor Chien-lung in 1737 to provide a boost to the agricultural sector. The work was published in 1742 and contains 78 books. It is generously illustrated and contains a large number of original engravings. The Library has two editions, one undated, but likely belonging to the latter half of the 1800s, and one copy dated 1826. The books will be on display in the study area of the David Lubin Memorial Library on the ground floor of Building A until the 20th of December.
