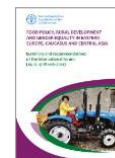

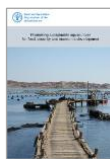

Special Report - 2021 FAO/WFP Crop and Food Security Assessment Mission (CFSAM) to the Republic of South Sudan

The year-on-year decrease in cereal production is mainly driven by reduced yields due to prolonged dry spells and widespread floods.

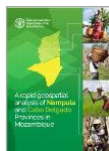
